

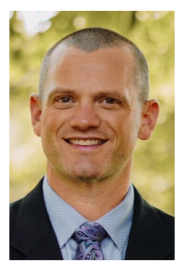

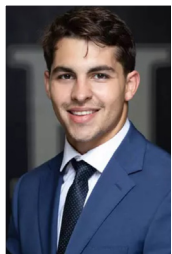

Passionate about inclusion and representation for all, Madeline strives to be a positive influence in the community for current and future generations and is looking forward to continuing her education at St. Norbert College.

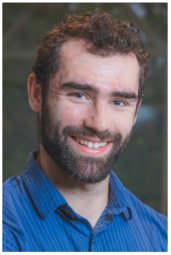

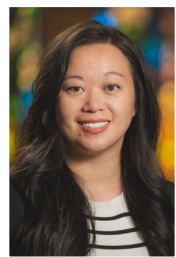
